

Rules and Regulations

Dress Code:

In order to maintain a Christian atmosphere at all times, we ask that no-one wear clothing that depicts anything that could be considered in poor taste or un-Christian.

- **BOYS**

Boys are expected to wear long pants. No shorts or cut-offs.

Clean and neat clothing is expected for service time.

No sweatpants, but track pants are allowable for activity time so long as they are not breakaway pants. (snaps etc.)

Shorts to the knee and T-shirts are required for swimtime.

- **GIRLS**

Should wear modest dresses and skirts. No sundresses,

low necklines, or anything above the knee is permitted.


Culottes are permitted for activities or a skirt with leggings.

No tank tops unless covered by another shirt or sweater.

No sleeveless shirts.

No pants are to be worn by girls or female staff.

Shorts and t-shirt are to be worn for swim time. No one piece or two piece bathing suits are permitted, unless under shorts and t-shirt.



Camp Director reserves the right to ask campers to change should they deem their clothing inappropriate or un-Christian.

YOU NEED TO BRING: Bible, Clothes for play time, and chapel, flip flops for to and from lake, toiletries, Bed linens / sleeping bag, flashlight, pen, notebook, wash clothes, towels, sunscreen, bug spray, tennis shoes.

CHILDREN UNDER 12 (with no Parent at Camp) - If children under 12 struggle with the rules, night times or other camp activities, parents should be prepared to pick them up. Children this young often do not do well without their parents. Please respond immediately to any call concerning your child. A pre camp arrangement is required for children under 12, to have an adult from their church directly responsible for them if their parent is not at camp. That caregiver is required to sign the registration form for those children.

DO NOT BRING: Cell phones, Any gaming device, mp3 players, ipods, tobacco, lighters, matches, any other electronic device. (Counsellors will have cell phones and provide any calls that are necessary). No photos are to be taken in dorms or at swim time. This is to protect the privacy of campers and counsellors. Failure to comply will result in loss of device or camera.

TOGETHER: All activities will be carried out in groups, and no youth are allowed to pair off and "do their own thing". All campers and adults will be assigned a team and required to participate.
